CALIFORNIA TRANSPARENCY IN SUPPLY CHAINS ACT OF 2010

Composite Engineering, Inc. (“CEI”) is committed to maintaining the highest standards of business conduct. The company requires its employees, agents, contractors and suppliers to behave in an ethical manner and to comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.

As a subsidiary of Kratos Defense & Security Solutions, Inc. (“Kratos”), CEI will be subject to and comply with the Kratos Code of Legal & Ethical Conduct. Every CEI employee will be required to read, understand, and comply with the Kratos Code of Legal & Ethical Conduct. Employees are required to complete an online Code of Conduct training course every two years. In addition, on a periodic basis, Kratos conducts mandatory Legal & Ethical Conduct Compliance training for pertinent employees. Kratos also maintains an Ethics Hotline, which enables employees or any third party to raise ethics concerns and questions. All concerns are investigated. When violations occur, corrective measures are promptly instituted and carried out.

CEI, a U.S. Government contractor, is governed by and complies with the Federal Acquisition Regulations (“FAR”), including FAR 52.222-50 “Combating Trafficking in Persons.” FAR 52.222-50 declares the U.S. Government’s zero tolerance policy for trafficking in persons and prohibits its contractors and subcontractors from using forced labor or engaging in severe forms of trafficking in persons. CEI flows this provision down to its subcontractors and suppliers where required by a U.S. Government contract and as a standard provision in the terms and conditions of CEI’s purchase orders.
